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Measures of Child Well-Being in Utah: What's Around the Corner for Kids

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What's Around the Corner for Kids?

It would be nice if we had a crystal ball that would tell us how our children would be doing two, five, or ten years down the road. If we knew with certainty what was around the corner for our children we could make thoughtful, calculated policy decisions which would ensure that they had the best opportunities to succeed.

To make plans for an increasing number of children it is imperative that we have good data on how children have fared in the past and how that compares to today. That is one of the basic premises of the KIDS COUNT Project: provide accurate, accessible data to make sure the future that is "just around the corner" is a positive one for all of Utah's children.

So how are the children doing?

One of the things we know about children in Utah is that there will be more of them in the future. Population estimates from the U. S. Census Bureau indicate that the average number of children in Utah between 2005 and 2007 was 794,549. Their projections indicate that by 2010 that number will have risen to 818,985 and by 2030 Utah's child population will be over one million. That's a lot of children who will need stable families, education, and health services!

Poverty rates have shown very slight improvements for children and families in recent years. Nevertheless, the data shows that families are struggling to make ends meet and that the poverty line, which is based solely on the price of food, falls woefully short of telling the whole story. The number of Utahns unemployed rose over 50% from February 2008 to February 2009. Food Stamp caseloads rose by 30% from 2008 to 2009 and TANF cases increased by 22% for the same time period. Almost one-third of Utah's school children are receiving free or reduced lunches based on their family's income, and we suspect more are eligible but have not applied for the benefit.

Many of the indicators of child well-being show very little change from year to year. However, two indicators show a troubling trend. Teen birth rates (ages 15-17) climbed for the third year in a row, from 14.8 per 1,000 teens in 2004 to 18.6 in 2007, a 26% increase. Research shows that children born to teen mothers are more likely to suffer poor health, experience learning problems, live in poverty, and become teen mothers themselves. If this trend continues, what's around the corner for Utah's teens may not be as promising as today.

In addition, the chlamydia infection rates in teens continues to soar, rising 20% from 2004 to 2006 and another 13% from 2006 to 2007. The Utah Department of Health indicates that chlamydia infections in 15 to 24 year olds is nearly twice that of any other intermountain state.

On a positive note, the percentage of women receiving prenatal care and the number of child abuse cases continue to make slight incremental improvements. And while substance abuse adjudications among children has fluctuated over the last few years, the number of adjudications for violent crimes has fallen slightly over the same time period.

One of the things we will need around the corner is a well educated workforce. Because math and science are the keys to innovation and power in today's world, our students need to be proficient in these subjects in order to be competitive in the job markets of the future. Current test scores indicate that almost one-third of Utah's students are not proficient in math and science. However, these scores are much worse for minority students. For example, almost 70% of students were proficient in math in 2007 but for African American students only 47% were math proficient. Lower test scores are prevalent in other subjects and with other minorities. This achievement gap will need to be addressed for these students to thrive in the future.

Another issue that our nation and Utah will be dealing with in the future is making sure that all children have health insurance and can receive the medical

services they need to grow and thrive. The number of uninsured children has continued to rise in Utah. Figures from the Utah Department of Health indicate a 57% increase in the number of uninsured children from 2003 to 2006. Close to 90,000 children are uninsured in Utah. As more children are covered and receive quality health care, they will have increased chances for success at home, in school, and in the future.

The newspapers are full of stories of economic hardships for Utah's families. The *Salt Lake Tribune* indicated that the number of homes receiving foreclosure notices rose 87% in the first quarter of 2009 compared to a year

ago. And the *Deseret News* reported a 47% increase in the number of bankruptcy filings from 2008 to 2009, almost twice as much as the year before. Looking around the corner we don't know what effect these negative figures will have on the child well-being indicators in this publication. We do know that it will be imperative that Utah makes plans to care for a possibly increasing number of children and families who find themselves in a position they never thought they would be in. We must begin to prepare today for what might be just around the corner for the children and families of Utah.

Definition: Data is for Kindergarten through 12th grade and includes Charter schools and represents the percent of the state's students who are receiving free or reduced lunches. Data is for a point in time enrollment number in October for each year. A child qualifies for free lunch if his or her family is at or below 130% of the federal poverty level. Children whose families are at 131-185% of the federal poverty level qualify for reduced lunches.

Children are automatically eligible for free meals if their household receives food stamps, benefits under the Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations or, the child receives benefits under Utah's Family Employment Program.

From July 1, 2009, to June 30, 2010, a family of four qualifies for free lunches if their income falls below \$28,665 and for reduced lunches if income falls below \$40,793.

Example: 3rd grade student takes the 3rd grade math CRT. For secondary students, this CRT is course specific. Students should take the CRT at the completion of the course. Example: Students enrolled in pre-algebra should take the pre-algebra CRT.

Science CRT: For 4 – 6 grade students, this CRT is grade specific. Students should take the test that corresponds to the grade in which they are enrolled. Example: 5th grade student takes the 5th grade science CRT. For secondary students, this CRT is course specific. Students should take the CRT at the completion of the course. Example: Students enrolled in biology should take the biology CRT.

Definition: The following rates represent the number of referrals (for juveniles) for the various offenses examined. Juvenile numbers are for youth through age 17. The referrals/filings do not include those cases where the victims did not press charges or where the police decided there was insufficient evidence to warrant adjudication. These are only the cases which actually made it to court. Two types of offenses are examined:

- Violent crime offenses in juvenile court - violent crimes are all felonies, plus class A, B, and C misdemeanors against persons and also class A misdemeanors against property. This includes murder, rape, and assault. They also include property crimes which are committed with a weapon.
- Substance abuse offenses in juvenile court - Substance abuse offenses are those that deal with alcohol, tobacco or a controlled substance (drugs).



County Data Tables Data Definitions

Education

Enrollment - Enrollment numbers are for the fall of each year and represent the number of students enrolled in Kindergarten through 12th grade. Does not include Charter Schools.

Pupil/Teacher Ratio - Pupil/Teacher ratios are based on the total number of students enrolled in Kindergarten through 12th grade and teachers include any person assigned to the school as a “regular classroom teacher”. This excludes Preschool teachers and special education teachers, guidance counselors, library specialist, etc. Does not include Charter schools.

Per Pupil Expenditure - Expenditures include instruction, support services, and nonsupport services (property, equipment, community service are excluded). Charter schools are included in these statistics.

Free and Reduced Lunch Participation - Data is for Kindergarten through 12th grade and includes Charter schools and represents the percent of the state’s students who are receiving free or reduced lunches. Data is for a point in time enrollment number in October or each year. (For a more detailed definition see page 19.)

Economics

Poverty - The federal poverty threshold for a two parent household with two children was \$21,027 in 2007. If a family makes less than this amount they are considered “in poverty”.

Median household Income - Median income divides the income distribution into two equal groups, one having incomes above the median and the other having incomes below the median. It includes all income for the entire family.

Unemployment - Seasonally adjusted unemployment rates.

TANF & Food Stamp Cases - The number of cases (households) receiving foodstamps or TANF at any time during the month indicated. A case is counted once even though there may be several individuals in the household.

Health

Prenatal Care - Number and percent of women receiving prenatal care in the first trimester as a percent of all live births for two, five year rolling averages.

Low Birth Weight Babies - Number of infants born weighing less than 2,500 grams (about 5.5 pounds) as a percentage of all live births for two, five year rolling averages.

Infant Mortality - An infant death is defined as death of a live-born infant within one year of birth. Rates are per 1,000 live births for two, five year rolling averages.

Injury Deaths - Child injury deaths are those occurring to individuals ages 1 to 19 due to injuries (accidents, suicides, and homicides). Rates are per 100,000 youth and are for two, five year rolling averages.

Teen Births - Live births to married and unmarried females ages 15 to 17. Rates are per 1,000 females in that age range. Data is for two, four year rolling averages (different than the above indicators), this indicator presents data for 04-07 and 00-03.

Uninsured Children - The number and percent of children ages 0-18 with no health coverage for a five year rolling average.

Child Abuse - The number is a distinct reported victim count. Victim counts across counties may be duplicated as a victim could have been serviced in more than one county. There may be more than one victim per case. Data are for a five year rolling average and rates are per 1,000 population.

Voices for Utah Children supports the work of other advocates, citizens and policy-makers by:

- Acting as a vital link to share ideas, trade information, and plan strategies.
- Connecting state and local advocates with national experts.
- Acting as a clearing house for child advocacy information and providing technical assistance in advocacy strategies and child related issues and policies.
