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INTRODUCTION



Data is a critical tool for understanding Utah's children and their families. Data is also crucial for informing policymakers to help them make wise decisions about laws and programs that affect children and their families.

At Voices for Utah Children, we strive to provide quality data to parents and families, community service providers, fellow advocates, and Utah's lawmakers. Each year, one crucial part of this data-sharing effort at Voices for Utah Children is releasing the Utah KIDS COUNT report, Measures of Child Well-Being in Utah, a project completed in partnership with the Annie E. Casey Foundation.

For the past 15 plus years, Terry Haven, Voices for Utah Children's former Deputy and KIDS COUNT Director, led the yearly publication effort. Many thanks to Terry for her diligent work and dedication to the children of Utah and creating the annual data book.

This year's edition of the data book is the first look at Utah and how it has navigated through the COVID-19 global pandemic. Like so many other facets of life, the pandemic significantly altered the collection of data in 2020 and 2021.

The KIDS COUNT project was no different and groups like Voices for Utah Children across the country had to adjust the report to tell the story of Utah children with the data that is available.

Utah, like the rest of the world, is still coping with the COVID-19 pandemic, and its effects on children will likely take many years or decades to be completely understood. Even though we still have much to learn about how children's lives have been altered by the pandemic, some of the story is starting to reveal itself in the data we have now.

We hope to shine a light on some of those early effects in this report. Utah is facing several significant challenges to recover from the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic, and we will continue to be a part of that recovery effort through the collection and reporting of data as well as telling the stories of children in Utah.

We hope that Utah policymakers and community partners will continue to utilize the data provided by the KIDS COUNT project to help develop programs and policies that will focus Utah's precious resources on improving the lives of children.

DEMOGRAPHICS

Utah continues to be the youngest state in the Union. Utah's population under the age of 18 makes up 29.8% of the state population of 3,096,848 persons.

With such a young population, the policies we implement as a state today will help children thrive and prosper in the future.

A closer look at the demographics of families with children of different ages helps us to better understand the diverse needs families may face based on the size of their families and age of their children.

A family with children under five will have far different child care needs than a family with all children over five. For that reason, in the county pages of this book, the demographic data of children is broken into two age groups.

The Voices for Utah Children's KIDS COUNT project utilizes the American Community Survey (ACS), a comprehensive survey of a random sample of the larger population, for estimates of state demographic data.

This data helps to show changes in trends over time, looking at how communities are changing and what their changing social and economic needs are. [i]



ECONOMICS

Some good news! Utah is fortunate that our economy has remained strong over the past several years, despite the challenges presented by the COVID-19 pandemic.

Throughout 2021, Utah has ranked near the top in the country in terms of unemployment numbers, job creation, and economic growth. [ii] Utah has led the nation in its recovery from the COVID-19 pandemic. [iii]

Utah received excellent news as the year 2021 was coming to a close in the Utah State Tax Commission's annual report. The report showed that Utah collected a total revenue of \$13.97 billion in the 2021 fiscal year. The amount was a 30.5 percent increase over 2020, equal to an additional \$3.26 billion. [iv]

Utah's strong fiscal health could help to improve the outcomes of Utah families. Utah is in a better position to invest in our children than many states, and we urge our policymakers to take the lead.

In a state with such a strong economy, even one child in poverty is too many and Utah's poverty rate of children under 18 is nearly 10 percent, and for children under five, just over 10 percent.

The data provided on the state page and in the following county pages is collected from the U.S. Census Bureau Small Area Income and Poverty Estimates (SAIPE) and the Utah Department of Workforce Service (DWS).



EDUCATION

In 2019 Utah finally dropped the dubious distinction of being in last place in per pupil funding in the nation.

Utah moved from the 51st position to 50th with Idaho taking the last place position. Utah had held that last place spot for over 20 years; an entire generation of Utah children was educated during that period.



No other state has held the ranking this long.^{v} According to the U.S. Census Bureau, in 2019 Utah spent \$8,014 per pupil, and Idaho's spending per pupil was \$7,985. The difference between the last two spots for education spending was 29 dollars per pupil. ^[vi]

COVID-19 had a significant effect on the state's education system and outcomes. For example, the Utah State Board of Education (USBE) suspended end-year assessment for the 2019-2020 school year. ^[vii] In comparing Utah's student proficiency results, there is a gap year.

This report shows the percentages provided for the 2018-2019 school year compared to 2020-2021. Student proficiency assessment results took a substantial hit. According to USBE's report released in October, one should be cautious when reading the differences.

The number of students who participated in the assessments for the 2021 school year compared to 2019 dropped and a sizable number for students groups who historically underperform. ^[viii]

The data presented on the state page and in the following county pages are collected from the Utah State Board of Education (USBE) website and with assistance from USBE employees.

According to the Utah Department of Health, during the COVID-19 pandemic parents of infants kept immunization appointments for their children. This did not hold true with parents of older children as the number of childhood immunization vaccinations in older children dropped drastically. ^[ix]

The COVID-19 pandemic also played a significant role in negatively impacting children's mental health, adding to a disturbing trend in child mental health. Mental health experts have been calling attention to this growing crisis in the U.S. over the last decade. ^[x]

At the end of 2021, the U.S. Surgeon General sounded the alarm on mental health and warned about the pandemic's impact on youth mental health. The Surgeon General also noted that mental health struggles affected the young even before the pandemic. Before the pandemic, one in five 3- to 17-year-olds struggled with either a mental, emotional, developmental, or behavioral disorder. ^[xi]

In Utah, data from the National Survey of Children's Health shows that children 3- to 17-years-old struggling with mental health issues, approximately 60% are not receiving mental health treatment.

Most of the data presented in the state page and in the following county pages has been collected from the Utah Department of Health, Public Health Indicator-Based Information System (IBIS).



HEALTH

Based on the health indicators collected for this yearly report, Utah remains stable compared to last year. Two areas even saw some positive change; the teen birth rate for females 15-17 dropped by 1.29 percent over last year (resulting in 171 fewer teen births in 2020), and the percentage of 2-year olds fully immunized increased by 2.10 percent.



SAFE COMMUNITIES

The Safe Communities data provides a look at Utah children's struggles in the areas of substance use, social and emotional health, physical health and safety, child abuse and neglect, and juvenile justice.



The data provided here is from the 2021 Student Health and Risk Prevention (SHARP) report by the Utah Division of Substance Abuse and Mental Health, Utah Division of Child and Family Services annual reports, the 2020 Crime in Utah report published by the Utah Department of Public Safety's Bureau of Criminal Identification (BCI), and Utah State Courts and the Administrative Office of the Courts.

2021 SHARP Survey

The SHARP survey is administered to kids in grades 6, 8, 10, and 12 every two years. The sampling method was the same as the previous years, and the time frame was extended for the survey.

In 2021, 40 school districts and 20 charter schools across Utah participated in the survey. The total number of students who participated was down from the 2019 survey. In 2021 the total number of students who answered the survey was over 71,000, compared to the over 86,000 students in 2019.

The decrease in participation is viewed as an impact of COVID-19. Even though the participation rate is not as high, data can still present a helpful portrait of 2021 students' health. Plus, the survey asked questions directly focused on COVID-19, and a few are shared in the list this year. {xii}

The 2021 SHARP Survey report shared in the KIDS COUNT book is the percentage of all grades. The report lists the results by each grade for each question and has the percentage for all grades.

Child Abuse Data

The data presented in the KIDS COUNT book on child abuse looks at the number of reports the Utah Division of Child and Family Services receives of child abuse and neglect.

The second data indicator is the number of children confirmed as abuse and neglect victims.

When a child and their family become involved with Child Protective Services (CPS), DCFS outlines that its goal is to assess the safety concerns first. An effective safety plan is developed for the child and to help the parents based on the results of that assessment.

Juvenile Justice

The juvenile justice data comes from the arrest data for the 2020 Crime in Utah report and directly from Utah Court data. The arrest data is the total number of arrests and the rate per 1000 "arrest data by agency" for the state of Utah, which counts the number of persons arrested.

Another set of data is juvenile arrest data cleared by exception. A juvenile clearance by exception is when a juvenile offender is involved in a minor offense and turned over to their parents or guardian. There is also no referral to juvenile court. The number of these arrests are significantly lower because not all agencies report this data. [xiv]

The Utah Courts provided the juvenile justice data for the period of October 1, 2019, through September 30, 2020. The data shows three types of delinquency referrals the Utah Juvenile Court received during that time frame.

The two types of detention are Community Placement Commitments and Secure Care Commitments. And the "number of events" for detention admissions the Division of Juvenile Justice had for the period.

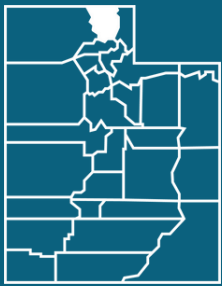

The survey questions asked are about "childcare, education, employment, energy use, food security, health, housing, household spending, Child Tax Credit payments, and intention to receive a COVID-19 vaccination."

Child Dependency Ratio

A measure derived by dividing the population under 18 years of age by the population ages 18 - 64 and multiplying by 100. The percentage of children under 18 who are not in the labor force dependent on the 18- to 64-year-old population for financial needs.

Households

A household includes all the people who occupy a housing unit (such as a house or apartment) as their usual place of residence. A household includes the related family members and all the unrelated people, if any, such as lodgers, foster children, wards, or employees who share the housing unit.

A person living alone in a housing unit, or a group of unrelated people sharing a housing unit such as partners or roomers, is also counted as a household. The count of households excludes group quarters. There are two major categories of households, "family" and "nonfamily." Household is a standard item in Census Bureau population tables.

Family Household

A family includes a householder and one or more people living in the same household who are related to the householder by birth, marriage, or adoption. All people in a household who are related to the householder are regarded as members the householder's family.

A family household may contain people not related to the householder, but those people are not included as part of the householder's family in census tabulations. Thus, the number of family households is equal to the number of families, but family households may include more members than do families.

A household can contain only one family for purposes of census tabulations. Not all households contain families since a household may comprise a group of unrelated people or one person living alone.

Own Children

A child under 18 years old who is a son or daughter by birth, marriage (a stepchild), or adoption. For 100 percent tabulations, own children consist of all sons/daughters of householders who are under 18 years of age.

For sample data, own children consist of sons/daughters of householders who are under 18 years of age and who have never been married, therefore, numbers of own children of householders may be different in these two tabulations.

Small Area Income and Poverty Estimates (SAIPE)

Census Bureau program that prepares mathematical model-based estimates of selected characteristics of the United States, states, and school districts.

- **Prenatal Care**

- **Low Birth Weight Babies**

Number of infants born weighing less than 2,500grams (about 5.5 pounds) as a percentage of all live births. Retrieved dates: November 11, 2021, for year group 2015-2016 and November 29, 2021, for group 2016-2020.

- **Infant Mortality**

An infant death is defined as the death of a live-born infant within one year of birth. Rates are per 1,000 live births. Retrieved dates: October 26, 2021, for year group 2016-2020 and November 11, 2021, for year group 2015-2019.

- **Teen Births**

Live births to married and unmarried females ages 15 to 17. Rates are per 1,000 females in that age range. Retrieved dates: November 11, 2021 for year group 2015-2019, and November 29, 2021, for year group 2016-2020.

- **Injury Deaths**

Child injury deaths occur to individuals ages 1-19 due to injuries (accidents, suicides, and homicides). Rates are per 100,000 youth. Retrieved date: November 15, 2021 for year groups 2015-2019 and 2016-2020.

- **Intentional self-harm (suicide) Deaths:**

Crude Rate, deaths per 100,000ages 10-17. Retrieved date: November 15, 2021 for year groups 2015-2019 and 2016-2020.

Immunization

By two years of age, it is recommended that all children should have received four doses of diphtheria-tetanus-pertussis (DTP), three doses of polio, one dose of measles-mumps-rubella (MMR),three doses of Hepatitis B, three or four doses of Haemophilus influenza type B (Hib) (depending on product type received), one dose of Varicella vaccine and four PCV. This recommendation is referred to in shorthand as “4:3:1:3:3:1:4.”

EDUCATION

The source for the following data came from the Utah State Board of Education:

- **Enrollment**

Enrollment numbers are for the Fall of each year and represent the number of students enrolled in kindergarten through 12th grade.

- **Pupil/Teacher Ratio**

Pupil/Teacher ratios are based on the total number of students enrolled in kindergarten through 12th grade. Teachers include any person assigned to the school as a “regular classroom teacher.” This excludes preschool teachers and special education teachers, guidance counselors, library specialist, etc. and does not include charter schools.

- **Free and Reduced Lunch Participation**

Data is for kindergarten through 12th grade and represents the percent of the state’s students who are receiving free or reduced lunches. Data is for a point in time enrollment number in October of each year.

- **Chronic Absence**

Of students with at least 45 days in membership, the percentage that were absent for at least 10% of their days in membership. This is a new definition and makes the data in this year’s book not comparable to other year’s data.

Results are comprised of the RISE assessment for grades 3-8 and the Utah Aspire Plus Assessment for grades 9-10.

A minor offense, lower than a felony. Misdemeanors in Utah are classified into three categories: Class A, B, and C.
