## Utah's Poverty Data at a Glance: Data from the American Community Survey

The American Community Survey (ACS) is designed to provide annually updated social, economic, and housing data for states and communities. Beginning in January of 2005, the U.S. Census Bureau expanded the ACS sample to 3 million households and it now provides users with poverty data on a yearly basis. The one year estimates are statistically sound at the state level. For county level data, three-year rolling averages are more accurate.

The 2008, a family of two adults and two children fell into the "poverty" category if their annual income was below \$21,200.

In addition, 4% of all children in Utah live in extreme poverty (50% below the poverty level), 21% live at 150% of poverty and over one-third (34%) live at 200% of poverty)
