- Developing research reports and policy briefs
- Self-time management and comfortable working in a collaborative environment
- Engaging and meeting youth, families and communities across the state with curiosity, humility and cultural sensitivity
- Developing and helping maintain new partnerships and working with coalitions across the state
- Meeting and building relationships with lawmakers, state and community leaders to educate, build awareness and advance change around key policy issues
- Media point person on key policy issues
