September 30th was the deadline for Congress to renew the <u>Children's Health</u> <u>Insurance Program, or CHIP</u>. So what happens now to the almost 20,000 Utah children who currently rely on CHIP for their health insurance?

First (a little) good news: Utah has enough money in its CHIP program to make it through the end of the year. Plus CHIP is a very popular program. Utah's own <u>Senator Hatch has come out with strong statements</u> in support of CHIP renewal, and is spearheading a bipartisan proposal to keep the program funded.

But here's the bad news: If Congress doesn't act soon, Utah's CHIP program will have to start <u>sending notices to families by early November.</u> So thousands of families could receive notices that their children no longer have health insurance coverage.

The other troubling news: While there are strong bipartisan solutions to extend CHIP funding for 5 years, the bill could get muddied up in GOP attempts to cut back funding to other vulnerable populations. It could become a <u>messy</u>, <u>bargaining 'chip'</u>...

What can you do? Tell Congress to stop playing games with children's health. They must act *now* on a <u>clean, 5-year extension of CHIP funding</u>. Otherwise almost 20,000 Utah kids could lose health coverage.

We cannot let that happen.

Call Utah Senators and House members today. Tell them to protect CHIP now -- without any interruptions to kids' coverage.
