If you want to get a jump start on Medicaid enrollment, qualifying individuals can enroll in the <u>Primary Care Network or PCN</u> now. Individuals who are already enrolled in PCN on April 1st should have an easy transition over to Medicaid coverage. PCN is having an open <u>enrollment NOW</u> through December 15th!

what's ahead:

Getting ready for enrollment: The Department of Health is already getting ready for the **April 1**st, **2019** enrollment date. They have said that they are on track to meet that deadline, working with the Department of Workforce Services to begin taking applications on April 1st.

The 2019 General Session: Medicaid expansion can be implemented without action by our Legislature. However, our Legislature may nevertheless address pieces of the new law during the 2019 Session. Changes to the law can come with additional costs, create barriers to care and delays- and they also undermine the voters' clear support for expansion as envisioned by the Affordable Care Act. As this conversation unfolds, we will be working hard to make sure expansion moves forward, just as Utah voters decided.

What can you do? Tell your <u>state representatives and senators</u> that you support Medicaid expansion, and want to see it move forward without added requirements or restrictions. Let's work together to help all Utahns access affordable health coverage, without delay!
