New Census Data Released Today

Today the U.S. Census Bureau released the state-level results of its 2017 American Community Survey (ACS) which includes topics such as income and poverty.

Income

Utah is not keeping pace with the rest of the nation. Despite a median household income increase of 4%, (\$65,977 in 2016 to \$68,358 in 2017), **Utah dropped to 13th place nationally after an 11th place finish in 2016.**

Poverty

Utah's poverty and child poverty rates both improved slightly in 2017, 9.7% and 10.7%, from 10.2% and 11.1% respectively. **Percentages broken out by race/ethnicity tell another story**.
